## **COVID-19 WORSHIP COMMANDMENTS**

- \* If you are sick, have a fever, are coughing, or have been in contact with someone diagnosed or showing symptoms of COVID – 19, please stay at home.
- \* If you are immuno-compromised be very careful. Consider watching the service at home on Facebook Live.
- \* Wear a mask at all times while in the building. Masks will be available if you should need one. No Mask – No admittance!
- \* Use hand sanitizer upon entry into the building. Please be aware of surfaces you touch.
- \* Bulletins and sanitizing supplies can be obtained at a special table set up in the narthex.
- \* Sit in the pew you are directed to by the usher. Seating has been reduced to maintain Social Distancing of six feet or more.
- \* Offerings will not be collected during the service; a collection plate will be available at each entrance to the sanctuary.
- \* There will be no personal greetings at the door before or after worship.
- \* Avoid physical contact with anyone you are not related to and living with.
- \* There will be no passing of the peace or personal contact during the service.
- \* The pastor will lead the liturgy and read all lessons to uphold safe distancing.
- \* Unfortunately, there will be no singing; Hum, Mouth the words, or Close your eyes and think the words.
- \* Water fountains are off-limits. You may bring your own bottled water or small bottles will be made available. Please take bottles with you.
- \* Wash your hands often.
